

# Two Halves Make a Whole

## Materials Needed

- 21 different 10 " squares of light fabric
- 21 different 10 " squares of dark fabric
- Cake Mix Recipe \#1 from Moda
- Boxy log cabin blocks - Assorted lights and darks. Each block requires a $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$ center square and a contrasting strip that measures $21 / 2^{\prime \prime} \times 20^{\prime \prime}$.
- Border \#1-1/2 yard background/light - Cut into $21 / 2{ }^{\prime \prime}$ strips
- Border \#2-5/8 yard background/light - Cut into $21 / 2$ " strips
- Border \#3-1 yard (I used a dark, floral print) - Cut 4" strips
- Binding - $5 / 8$ yard


## Cake Mix Blocks

Following instructions on Cake Mix Recipe paper, make 21 of the pages. Assemble them into blocks like this: You will have 21 of each. Blocks should measure 8 ½" square.


## Boxy Log Cabin Blocks

Each Boxy Log Cabin requires a center square which measures $21 / 2^{\prime \prime}$. You will make 21 with dark centers and 21 with light centers. The outer round of the block requires 4 pieces - (2) $2 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ squares and (2) $2 \frac{1}{2} 2^{\prime \prime} \times 6 \frac{1}{2 \prime \prime}$ rectangles. On the blocks with light centers, the outer round is dark. On the blocks with dark centers, the outer round is light. Blocks should measure $61 / 2 "$ square.
